The Health and Care Act 2022 has made major changes to the NHS in England, including making Integrated Care Systems a formal, statutory body with power over NHS commissioning and spending at a local level. The session will help to explain all of this, so you can better understand the national landscape and how the NHS is organised and what this means for us all locally.

NHS Frimley updates

Our colleagues will also share some key updates about how locally they are delivering the ambition set out in the NHS Long Term plan linked to Neurodiversity. This includes updates about new training (Oliver McGowen), an update on the Gem Services and information about the new key worker autism pilot delivered by Barnardo's due to start this month.
